Health Papers

All goats, sheep, beef, swine must have signed health papers from a vet.

(This is not a new rule, see page 4 of last year's fair book. Last year's fair book can be found on our website.)

- Make an appointment with your vet between July 2nd and Aug. 1st
- Vet will check all animals and sign health papers for each tagged animal
- When you bring your animals to the fair, your trailer will be stopped at the 4-H horse arena to show proof of health papers.
- As long as all animals in the trailer are listed on the health papers you will be allowed to unload as normal.
- Unloading will be one way traffic. Please pay attention to signs.
- In order to check health papers, there will be a window in which to bring your animals to the fair. <u>Times will be</u> <u>Tuesday from 2:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. or Wednesday</u> <u>morning from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.</u>
- Remember weighing of market animals begins at 7:00

 a.m. on Wednesday. We recommend that all market
 animals come Tuesday. Breeding animals, horses, poultry
 and rabbits can come Tuesday or Wednesday.

Horses must show proof of Coggins when arriving at fairgrounds. Check-in exceptions for horses showing in open class.

Poultry must be tested for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days of the fair. Free testing day is June 28th at the Fairgrounds from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Must show Katie your paperwork or show up to testing day.

Rabbits no health papers needed. Each rabbit will be checked by the superintendent.
