#### WEIGH-IN DATES

Beef Weigh-In: Canceled

There will not be a beef rate of gain contest for this year. We will no longer be having the formal beef weighin/tagging on April 11th. Here is the new procedure for this year. On Thursday April 2nd from 6-8pm there will be a Beef tag pick time at the Fairgrounds. We will be set up on the east side of the Livestock Barn. It is asked that you enter on through the North entrance of the fairgrounds and exit out the south entrance. You will be required to pay for your tags when picking them up. You will be required to put the exact amount for all tags there will be no change. (If you write a check make it payable to Crawford County 4-h Council) All tags must be paid for that day! I will also have small animal tags available if anyone would like to pick those up as well. County tags are \$1 per tag, State Beef tags are \$4 per tag, Small State Tags (sheep, goats, swine) are \$3 per tag.

This will work like a drive through. NO ONE IS ALLOWED TO EXIT THEIR VEHICLE AT ANY TIME. You will be given your tags then you are asked to immediately leave the fairground to return home. You will be responsible for tagging your animal at home. Once your animal is tagged you will need to submit a clear color photo of the animal with the tag in its ear to me via email willmorris@ksu.edu. You must submit beef photos by April 11th at 3:30 p.m. Any beef photos not in by that time will not be eligible to participate at the fair.

If you are unable to pick up your beef tags on April 2nd from 6-8pm at the fairgrounds please let me know so we can make other arrangements. Small animal (sheep, swine, goat, bucket calf) weigh-in is May 9th. For now it will still be held on that date. Details for how we will go about that day will be released at a later date. If you are unable to make that date please let me know so we can make arrangements.

## KANSAS STATE FAIR OR KANSAS JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW

If you plan to nominate animals for either of these shows you must tag and complete paperwork by: Steers & Market Heifers due May 1.

Swine Goats, Lambs, & Heifers due June 15<sup>th</sup>.

The paperwork must be signed by Will (please email Will at willmorris@ksu.edu to make arrangements to get signed). They need to be in the state office by these dates!

# UPDATED 3/16 - Recommendations for 4-H Clubs and Local 4-H Activities and COVID

• AN IMPORTANT COVID-19 UPDATE As of 3/16/2020, Kansas State University leadership extended the timeline for our COVID-19 response protocols to eight weeks. They are even cancelling the face-to-face commencement ceremonies.

Concerning Extension-sponsored (which includes all 4-H programming by employees and volunteers) face-to-face workshops, shows, activities, and events that are targeted to the people we serve, such face-to-face events should be cancelled, postponed, or converted to such distance technologies as Zoom is extended through May 16.

- 4-H implication: Even in light of this directive, it is prudent for KSRE professionals to communicate with their local health department for the latest risk assessment and recommendations. Communication from KSRE professionals and boards regarding 4-H activities should be in alignment with such recommendations and communicated to local 4-H volunteers in a timely fashion.
- According to the CDC, older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions like heart disease, diabetes and lung disease are at greater risk for getting very sick from this illness.
- 4-H implication: As youth and adults frequently interact together in 4-H learning opportunities, it is prudent for KSRE professionals to assess the potential risk of 4-H related activities to vulnerable populations (identified above).

# **Being Patience and Keeping Perspective**

I hope that you and your families are staying safe and healthy during this time. I have received lots of questions from 4-H members, volunteers, family and community members in regard to the Crawford County Fair. Examples "Should we buy animals?" "Is the fair going to happen?" "Can we figure out another way or time to weigh the steers?" "Why can't we just proceed as normal but be safe?" etc. I think it is so awesome that we have so many people passionate about youth! But I ask you to help me in sharing this information with them.

The number one priority of myself and the Fair Board is the health, safety, and wellbeing of the youth, volunteers, and their families. With that being said, we also want to try to lessen the impact that COVID-19 is having as much as possible. Activity changes, cancelations, and updates will be broadcasted as soon as they are known. Things are evolving rapidly and can cause changes daily. If we can make something happen that was previously canceled, we will do so. Things may not be "fair" from one project/species to another, but please know that your patience, understanding, and ability to go with the flow with be greatly appreciated.

We may not have all the answers to the questions above yet, but it is important for us all to keep perspective on what 4-H truly is. It is

a **Youth Development Organization!** 4-H is about more than showing and exhibiting at the fair. Its purpose is more than getting that purple rosette and being the top seller at the sale. 4-H is about learning, teaching, and developing knowledge and skills. It is about developing tomorrow's leader. And a sign of a true leader is their ability to adapt and proceed with their best foot forward.

I encourage families to sit down and discuss your goals for this year. Next, consider how those goals may or may not be impacted with the current circumstances. Please keep in mind that some goals may come with a risk and financial cost. This may include buying animals, feed, supplies, etc. without knowing the future plan for the fair. Remember, there is no way of knowing what might be affected as this situation evolves. You and your families will have to determine what risk you are willing to take, and can afford, and be willing to live with that outcome.

Remember we are here for the youth! I will continue to look for ways to engage our members in activities within the limitations of our current situation. We are here to teach them and help them to become tomorrow's leaders. ©
