Enroll now in Crawford County 4-H!

Step-by-step instructions can be found on our Crawford 4-H website or at https://ks.4honline.com/

The system will save your information from last year. If you are a returning member do not create a new account. Please use the "<u>forgot password</u>" option if you don't remember your information from last year. **New families will need to follow the instructions for new families on our website or at https://ks.4honline.com/.**

Paper enrollment options are available in the office.

Don't forget we are part of the Wildcat Extension District; you are looking for Wildcat District, Girard.

The state 4-H office is charging a \$15 fee per child that can be paid using 4-H Online or by mailing in a check to the state. Our local office can NOT accept money. When you fill out the online enrollment you can apply for a fee waiver. There are multiple reasons to apply for a waiver such as free and reduced lunches, multiple children in 4-H, single income families, etc. I strongly suggest families utilize this option if needed; this is private information and will not be shared. PLEASE do not stop participating due to the fee.

Record Books

Kansas 4-H is updating the record book process. Wildcat District has been chosen as a pilot for the new process. This is a good opportunity for us to provide feedback to the state 4-H office on the new process and provide uniform books across the district. The new record book process will be completed using form-fillable PDFs. In the future there will be an option to complete record books online through the app Zsuite. The pilot record books are broken into three age divisions based on 4-H age. Record books should be separated by project area (ie. folder for Beef, folder for clothing, ect.) Offices can help make copies of current year's personal page and current year's permanent record.

4-H Campference

4-H Campference is for youth ages 12- 14 (before January 1, 2020), and will be held June 22-25 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Participants will experience the feel of a conference, while enjoying the 'camp' activities Rock Springs 4-H Center has to offer. This is a great transitional opportunity, as these tweens go from being a camper to attending educational conferences. 4-H Campference will feature workshops about opportunities in the 4-H program and how to better interact with others. Participants will meet other youth from around the state of Kansas. Registration and detailed information will be the State 4-H Website in March Register early as the space will fill on a first come basis, and Campference was full the last 6 years! Register online by May 15 (or earlier it will close when it is full) and payment must be in the local Extension Offices by May 15.

If you were selected to represent Crawford County at the area KAP judging, please transfer your information from the project record to a KAP document. Appointments can be set-up with Will to help with this process. KAP formatted books are due in the office by Jan. 14th.

State 4-H Scholarship Application

High school seniors don't forget to complete county and state 4-H applications! Both forms can be found on our Crawford County webpage! County scholarships are due in July but it's never too early to get it submitted! State scholarships are due in the Girard Extension office by January 23 and we will mail them to the state.

Project Leaders

State 4-H Horse Judging Contest

The 2020 State Horse Judging Contest will be held on Friday, March 6, in conjunction with Equifest held in Salina.

2020 4-H Horse Panorama

The 2020 Horse Panorama will be held January 24-26 at Rock Springs. Rules and registration will be up shortly. The deadline for registration is January 15th.

Kansas Junior Producer Days

The Kansas Junior Producer Days will be hosted in February and March 2020 on the Kansas State University campus in Weber Hall. Since 2020 is an even year, we will host beef and sheep junior days. These events are one-day educational programs for youth, parents, project leaders and agents to learn about selecting and

managing a youth livestock project. For both days, tentative topics include selection, nutrition, meat science, health and showmanship. There will also be an opportunity for youth to become certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA), which is the new, national, multi-specie youth livestock quality assurance program. The YQCA session will take place at the conclusion of each junior producer day. Junior Beef Producer Day is scheduled for Saturday, February 29, and Junior Sheep Producer Day will be hosted on Saturday, March 14. Judging Teams

Now is the time to express interested in livestock, horse, horticulture, skill-a-thon, meats, and quiz bowl teams! Teams are not currently practicing but we will get you on their contact lists for spring practices. Judging teams offer youth the opportunity to travel and interact with 4-H youth! Practices are not currently being held in Crawford County, but if youth start attending practices coaches have shown they are willing to move to more central locations or even in county. We need parents and youth to make the first step and we will do everything we can to help!

Volunteers

Volunteers must renew their certification very three years with a background check. As agents, we truly appreciate the time you spend with our youth. You are the reason 4-H works and we can teach our youth leadership, responsibility, good morals, and hands-on learning! We want to ensure our youth are safe and have the best environment around them to continue learning these things. You can help us by filling out the required paperwork. Then your certification will be good for another three years! Do you know someone that is good at cooking, sewing, rockets, legos, etc. and would be a great volunteer to help 4-H youth? Have them contact the Extension office! We are always looking for volunteers. Being a 4-H volunteer does not mean you have to attend every monthly meeting. Maybe you only help with gardening project meetings twice a year! Volunteers will need to go through the certification process.
