Kansas 4-H is updating the record book process. Wildcat District has been chosen as a pilot for the new process. This is a good opportunity for us to provide feedback to the state 4-H office on the new process and provide uniform books across the district. The new record book process will be completed using form-fillable PDFs. In the future there will be an option to complete record books online through the app Zsuite. The pilot record books are broken into three age divisions based on 4-H age. Record books should be separated by project area (i.e. folder for Beef, folder for clothing, etc.) Offices can help make copies of current year's personal page and current year's permanent record. If you are interested in practicing with one of the competitive teams below, call or email Will at the Extension office!

Skill-a-thon tests a 4-H member's knowledge and comprehension of animal science and livestock management practices. Typical topics are livestock equipment identification, livestock breed identification, retail meat cut identification, Hay and wool judging, quality assurance, and a quiz about the livestock industry.

Quiz Bowl contestants answer questions via a buzzer system on wide array of questions that cover the beef, sheep, swine and meat goat project areas.

Livestock Judging – rank pens of beef, sheep, swine, and meat goats based on the animal's production or reproduction qualities.

YQCA Requirements for State Shows

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a new, national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program that focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character development, through age-appropriate educational curriculum for youth 7-21 years of age. This program is an annual certification that grows with a young person, so the learning modules are different every year. The YQCA program is replacing the PQA program. The PQA is no longer valid. ALL exhibitors are required to be YQCA certified in order to participate in the 2020 Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS). This includes youth who will be showing market animals, commercial breeding females, and/or registered purebred breeding females. There will be a specific junior class offered (7-year-old members must attend a Jr class). These dates and times haven't been announced yet. Be on the lookout for additional training days that will be set up soon.


The 4-H Wildcat district - Crawford county, is lucky to have the 4-H Shooting Sports Program which includes archery, hunting skills, pellet pistol and pellet rifle, and bb rifle, shooting sports. The pellet pistol course will be starting on February 16th and continue for 5 consecutive meetings (Feb 16 and 23, March 1, 8, and 15) ending just prior to spring break for many schools. The course meets in the Marvin Green building at the Crawford County Fairground and topics include, proper grip, sight alignment, sight picture, proper body positioning, eye dominance, muzzle awareness, trigger control, accuracy, shooting etiquette and of course pistol safety. There is lots of practice to help students to develop the shooting skills which can be help them have fun and become proficient in pistol shooting for the rest of their life. Because the air pistols are manually charged with air as well as the safety considerations related to the short barrels of a pistol, students must be 12-year-old or older to participate. Junior Beef Producer Day


Junior Beef Producer Day is scheduled for Saturday, February 29, 2020, in Weber Arena on the K-State campus in Manhattan. This one-day educational event is devoted to the selection and management of youth beef projects. All ages and knowledge levels are invited! K-State faculty members, graduate students, livestock judging team members, and guest speakers will cover topics including selection, nutrition and feeding, meat science and alternative proteins, grooming and clipping, low stress cattle handling, the state livestock nomination process, herd health, reproduction, and showmanship. An optional instructor-led YQCA training will also be held at the conclusion of the program.

The cost for junior beef producer day is \$15 per person, if registration is submitted by February 7, 2020, or \$20 per person after the deadline. All attendees, including youth and adults, must register. All participants who sign up by February 7 will also receive a t-shirt. Families may register online at http://bit.ly/ksuasiregister or by downloading the flyer (http://bit.ly/ksujrproducerdays), completing the bottom portion of the flyer and mailing it, with payment, to the KSU Youth Livestock Program. 4-H Campference is for youth ages 12- 14 (before January 1, 2020), and will be held June 22-25 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Participants will experience the feel of a conference, while enjoying the 'camp' activities Rock Springs 4-H Center has to offer. This is a great transitional opportunity, as these tweens go from being a camper to attending educational conferences. 4-H Campference will feature workshops about opportunities in the 4-H program and how to better interact with others. Participants will meet other youth from around the state of Kansas. Registration and detailed information will be the State 4-H Website in March Register early as the space will fill on a first come basis, and Campference was full the last 6 years! Camp Scholarships

This year there are Camp Scholarships available through 4-H Council thanks to the generous donations in the community. These are limited to one per-youth per-year. To be eligible you must complete a Talk/Demonstration at County 4-H Club days or participate at Favorite Foods Contest. The Scholarship will be refunded up to \$100 upon the youths return from camp.
