ALL MARKET BEEF NEEDS TO BE TAGGED IN ON OR BEFORE THIS DAY IN ORDER TO BE ABLE TO SHOW AT THE FAIR. If you are unable to attend this day, you must contact me to set up a time to meet with you to tag your animals before April 1st. Do not wait until the last minute in order to ensure that your animals get tagged on time.

Breeding Beef do not have to tag in. Bucket Calves will tag in on May 13th.

Small Animal Tag/weigh-in day for MARKET GOATS, MARKET SHEEP, MARKET SWINE, AND BUCKET CALF will be on May 13th 8:00-10 a.m. at the Fairgrounds. ALL MARKET GOATS, MARKET SHEEP, MARKET SWINE, AND BUCKET CALVES NEED TO BE TAGGED IN ON OR BEFORE THIS DAY IN ORDER TO BE ABLE TO BE SHOWN AT THE FAIR. If you are unable to attend this day you must contact me to set up a time to meet with you to tag your animals before May 13th. Do not wait until the last minute in order to ensure that your animals get tagged on time.

Updates to Kansas 4-H Horse Project

Beginning with the 2023 4-H Program Year, Kansas 4-H Horse Project Members, who are currently enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project are eligible to compete at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show if:

- 1.) The horse is properly identified for the Kansas 4-H Horse Project either by a) registering the horse with a breed association in the 4-H'ers or an immediate family member's name by June 1 of the current 4-H program year, or b) identifying with a Kansas 4-H Horse ID Form signed by the local Extension Agent by June 1 of the current 4-H program year. The 4-H member must have a copy of the 4-H Horse ID form signed by the local agent or a copy of the horse's registration papers on file with their local Extension Office by June 1 of the current 4-H program year.
- 2.) Exhibit a properly identified horse at a horse show in a class group and be qualified to exhibit in any class included in that group. The horse show need not be a "4-H" show. Shows may include: open shows, circuits, local associations (SCSHA, etc), and breed/discipline associations (AQHA, APHA, NRHA etc.). Qualification for each group is based on one horse/rider combination. Exception: If if a 4-Her qualifies more than one mare/gelding in the same halter class. In this case, another 4-Her can show the second horse in the appropriate halter class at the State Fair.

Group 1 Halter, Showmanship

Group 2 Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunter Hack, Saddleseat Pleasure, Saddleseat Equitation

Group 3 Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Trail,

Group 4 Ranch Rail, Ranch Pattern, Ranch Trail, Reining

Group 5 Barrels, Poles, Flags

3.) Complete the Kansas 4-H Equine Webinar Safety Episode with quiz annually before completing the State Fair Entry.

Complete online entry information for the Kansas State 4-H Horse Show via ShoWorks by August 1 of the current program year.

Exhibitors will be limited to entering only those classes in which they qualified for a particular horse.

Exhibitors should be prepared to show proof of exhibition via a signed affidavit by show management.

The qualification period will be from October 1-August 1 of the current 4-H program year.

Wanted Host Families for Japanese Exchange Summer 2023

Looking for fun and excitement this summer? Host a new friend from Japan in your home this summer, July 22 – August 17. Kansas 4-H International Exchange Programs are offering hosting opportunities for 30-35 families this summer. Host families are needed who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl. The Japanese youth will be between the ages of 12 - 16. Our responsibility is to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other.

Any Kansas family with children aged 10-16, who is interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily, a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. They can go on host family vacations, and camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is everyday family life. Interested families can complete the application at https://www.states4hexchange.org/apply/host/ to start the process.

Complete Your Host Family Application Now!

February is the ideal time to start your family's experience in another part of the globe. By hosting a 4-H International Exchange, you will open up your family to the world. This year you can welcome a youth from Japan or Korea for a month next summer or for the next school term. You may be able to host a 4-H teen from Norway or Costa Rica for a month next summer. Or you might welcome an IFYE (over 18) from Europe, Asia, Africa or Latin America for 2-3 weeks between June and September.

Intrigued, but don't know where to start? Start by completing a Host Family Application in February and list your choices for one-month States' 4-H teen exchanges. The application is the same for all States' 4-H International Exchanges one-month summer programs. You can find a link to an inquiry form at www.Kansas4-h.org under "News and Updates".

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Crawford County Fair Board and the Livestock Sale Committee are looking for 2 people to volunteer and perform the outlined task below. Ideally, the people fulfilling these task have a knowledge of livestock sales (preferably Crawford County), are organized, and efficient, works well with others, and are good with numbers.

The outline of responsibilities are listed below as well as the times of when they are performed.

• Attend sale committee meetings, typically held during the winter or spring.

• Friday of Fair-

- Review and check the entered destinations for each species provided by Extension staff.
- Utilize the FairEntry system to organize and configure the sale catalog. This is done after the noon deadline when destination slips are to be submitted. Once the catalog is complete, it is to be emailed to buyers and posted on the Fair Facebook page.

Saturday of Fair-

- Before the sale, help to check in buyers at the ring.
- Assist during the sale with imputing and tracking the information.
- Provide a Destination packing list for base bid buyers after the sale.
 - Mail them a copy after the fact as well to the base bid.
- Post SaleThese can either be done on
 Saturday after the sale or best case would be
 Sunday or Monday after the fair at the latest
 - Make adjustments to each sale member in order for the math to be correct in the system.
 - Review each buyer's statement and mail them to buyers so they have something for their records and know what to pay youth.
 - Review the check for each youth to ensure that they are all correct before printing checks. If they are correct print and mail checks at the earliest time.
 - Track that base bids are paid to the Fair Board.


2023 Spring PEN PAL PROGRAM
