Fair Entry Open

You can now go online and begin your entries for the fair! Please check out the website. Also, do not forget to reserve your spot for consultative judging. The deadline to enter is July 15th. *In FairEntry*, the questions about how many animals you are bringing are for the stall reservation, not the class entry. Do not hit submit until you have entered everything. If you need help, call the office. IF YOU FEEL YOU MAY NEED HELP OR FEAR YOU WILL NEED HELP BEFORE THE DEADLINE, YOU MUST REACH OUT BEFORE JULY 10 AT 4:30 PM. (This is only if you need help entering) AFTER THAT, TINA NOR I WILL BE ABLE TO ASSIST YOU BEFORE THE JULY 15 DEADLINE.

Pre-Fair and Indoor Judging Information

We hope you are starting to think about your indoor projects for the Fair. Please be sure to note dates and times this year on the 2025 Fair Schedule!

Michelle Broxterman, FCS Agent, has highlighted some of the major reminders below:

- ➤ Consultation Sign Up is Open for Arts & Crafts (Visual Arts), Foods, Food Preservation, and Photography Please go to http://bit.ly/CRJudging to select your consultation time. You may drop off exhibits to be judged without consultation if you so desire. Please note that Foods and Clothing will be held at the Beulah Community Church Activity Building, just off of K-7 South of Girard. North of Beulah Community Church, Clark St, Girard, KS 66743.
- ➤ For Buymanship (Shopping in Style) and Style Revue
 - Clothing Construction will start at 8:00 am.
 - Buymanship Fashion Revue will start at 9:00 am, come ready!
 - Style revue for constructed garments will start at 11:30 am, or following Buymanship
 - A script for both buymanship and style revue should be provided at preentry. Here are recommendations: Scripts should be 4-6 sentences in length. Write it exactly as you want it to be read during the judging. Include the member's name and 4-H club somewhere in the first sentence. Some descriptors may include fabric, colors, patterns, where you will wear the outfit, what you like best, etc. Feel free to include hobbies and other information about yourself.
 - The following forms are required to be completed for the day of judging and are located on the CR County Fair website. Here is a shortcut: https://bit.ly/CRclothing
 - a. Cost Per Wear
 - b. Evaluation Score Sheet
- ➤ For Foods/Food Preservation Judging

- This year, Food Preservation will be judged at the same time as Foods at the Beulah Community Center.
- Plan to arrive 5 minutes prior to the scheduled time (food must be ready for display, there will <u>not</u> be time to prep) to take a photo and fill out your Fair Display Sheet.

Please Note Approximate Judging Times for Indoor Exhibits on Wednesday, July 30, 11:00 am and 11:30 am, full list in the 2025 Fair Schedule.

Pre-Fair Clean-Up

The annual pre-fair cleanup will be on Tuesday, July 22, from 6-9 pm at the fairgrounds. The Fair Board is so appreciative of the time and work that you put in! Please bring weed eaters, shovels, wheel barrels, rakes, brooms, staple guns, gloves, and whatever else you may need to lend a helping hand! If you are unsure what to do or do not have a task, please do not hesitate to ask a Fair Board Member, me, or the Club Leader.

Post-Fair Clean Up

It is important, as 4-H members, that we leave things better than we found them. On Sunday, August 3rd, be sure that you are cleaning your pens, picking up your projects, cleaning your camping area, and cleaning the area your club is responsible for. Any exhibitor who does not clean his/her stall will forfeit all premium money, and will be charged \$50 per stall paid to the CCFA and will not be allowed to show in that department the next year.

Fair Catalogs

Fair catalogs are funded by advertisements from local businesses. These advertisements are still being collected, so the fair catalog will be printed. UNTIL then, please see our website or app for an updated 2025 version of the fair catalog.

Pre-Fair BBQ Tickets

Tickets have been given to club leaders. Each member is required to sell five tickets. There are prizes for the top 4 ticket sellers. To be considered for the top seller, you must turn in the ticket count by July 24. The BBQ is on Sunday, July 27, 5:30-7:00 PM at the Fairgrounds.



Annual Pre-Fair BBQ

Pre-Fair BBQ will be held July 27 in the Marvin Green Building at the fairgrounds.

Each family is asked to sell 5 tickets per child. Purchasing tickets for 4-H supporters, leaders,

plaque sponsors, or livestock buyers is a great way to say thank you! There will be an award for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place sellers (unless a winner sold under 25 tickets). Money raised from our BBQ pays for judges at club days, gas money to 4-H camps, fair supplies, the awards banquet, and meals, etc.

Setting the Stage for a Great Fair!

Some of these you may feel do not apply to you, but they are important reminders for us all. It will also help ensure we keep each other accountable and hopefully provide youth with a fun, safe, positive experience. Parents, please share this with your spouse to ensure everyone is on the same page. Attitudes-Positivity! This is what I expect from everyone this year, as we are just over a week away from the first official Fair activity. (Beef Weigh-In) Some of you do a fantastic job, but others may need a reminder. 4-H is a Positive Youth Development organization, and sadly, on many occasions, some parents, volunteers, fair board members, etc., seem to lose sight of that. What has happened is in the past, and everyone is expected to do their best moving forward. As they prepare to enter any 4-H

event, I hope everyone checks their attitude at the door.

<u>Relationships-</u> Personal relationships are just that personal. No room exists for personal hatred, conflict, or rivalry at any 4-H event/activity. Your relationships are yours alone and have no business infecting the attitudes and experiences of those around you.

Grace and Understanding- Everyone is expected to have grace and understanding. NO ONE is perfect or is going to do things perfectly. Not everything will be done or addressed when and how you would like. Not every rule or policy is going to be agreed upon or liked. However, it is expected that everyone shows a little grace and understanding in that everyone is doing their best to do right by all youth.

<u>Criticism vs. Clarification-</u> There is a vast difference between the two, starting with your approach. Myself, superintendents, leaders, volunteers, and fair board members are ALWAYS open to clarifying questions. Those putting on 4-H events/activities do not deserve nor will tolerate unnecessary criticism/complaining. If you want change, we have a fair proposal process, and you better be ready to step up and volunteer.

Respect- You don't have to like what/how things

are done, other families, rules/procedures, etc., but you must RESPECT them. You are expected to show respect to everyone, even if you disagree. You are not owed or guaranteed an explanation/justification for every decision/rule made. Still, you must trust that there was thought and reason put into every decision to try and keep a positive and safe environment for all youth. You must respect that sometimes things must be addressed/changed at the moment, and that time does not always allow for a seamless transition.

<u>Conflict-</u> With anything, there is likely to be conflict at times, but the difference comes in how you handle it. Remember always to respond and not react. Allow yourself and others time to process what is happening and address conflict calmly, coolly, and collectedly. Don't forget that a young person is likely watching and learning from you wherever you are, so be sure to be a positive role model.

What's your why? - Not every family has the same goals and values when participating in the fair. Some may want to help their child learn to care

for and raise livestock. Some may want to win a grand champion ribbon and be the top seller at the livestock sale; regardless of your family's why, it is essential to remember that what other families choose as their "why" is out of anyone's control. As a parent, this may be hard to explain or rationalize to your youth, but it teaches them to focus on themselves and their knowledge and skill development instead of others.

<u>Fun-</u>Let's all remember to have fun! There is so much time, energy, money, and resources that go into 4-H events/activities that if we are not all having fun, we need to figure out something that is. These are the memories that youth will carry with them for a lifetime, so it is our job to make sure they are positive ones.

<u>Open Door-</u>Remember that my door is always open. If you have questions or want to learn more, you will get a lot further and have more accurate information coming from me rather than taking secondhand information. So, if we need to chat, call the office or email me, and we can set up a time.

Fair Stall Reservation

This is done through the fair entry process when you enter. Each exhibitor will only be allotted stalls based on the number of animals present at check-in. Entering extra animals that you do not bring in order to get extra stall space will not be tolerated. If it is determined that you have excess space, then you will be required to move to make room for other exhibitors. This is due July 15, the same time as entries.

Crawford County Fair July 30- August 2, 2022

All animals must pass through a vet check. Market Animals must have state ear tags – Breeding Animals should have ear tags from you or the seller.

ALL ANIMALS MUST BE CASTRATED!

BEEF: Ear Tags & Vet Check **SWINE**: Ear Tags & Vet Check

GOATS: Meat & Dairy - Ear Tags, Vet Check, &

scrapie identification tags

SHEEP: Ear Tags, Vet Check, & scrapie

identification tags

HORSES: Vet Check and a Negative Coggins paper must be shown to the superintendent

POULTRY: Vet check and health will be assessed by the superintendent.

RABBITS: No health papers. Vet check and Health will be assessed by the superintendent. Must have an ear tattoo.

DOG: Must have dog immunization record signed by a vet and a signed note from the vet saying the dog is flea-free.

A timeline has been established for bringing animals to the fair to allow them to be checked. The south gate of the fairgrounds will be locked. All trailers must enter from the north gate. Trailers will be stopped at the horse area for their health to be assessed by a veterinarian. Pay attention to signs, there will be ONE-WAY traffic around the barns. No animals will be allowed to come onto the fairgrounds outside of these hours:

Tuesday, July 29 – 3:00- 8:00 p.m. 4-H Weigh-in Tuesday, July 29

No reweighs allowed. All market animals must weigh! Scales open at 3:00 p.m.

All market animals, bucket calves, feeder steers, and Class 2 & 3 Breeding Doe Meat Goats will be weighed. The scales will be open on Tuesday, July 29, of fair week from 3:00 pm-8:00 pm for weighing of Market and Feeder Steers, Bucket Calves, Lambs, and Goats. All species are allowed to weigh in during that time, except swine. Swine will begin weigh-in at 8 p.m. The alleyway will be set up from 8-9 p.m. on July 29 to weigh in. Once the alleyway is set up, no other species will be allowed to weigh in. Please be ready to bring your animals to the scales during this time. No re-weighs will be allowed.

Animal Destination Form

If you bring a market animal to the fair, we need to know what you plan to do with that animal. Please fill out a destination form telling us if the animal is going home, sold on a base bid truck, or going through the livestock sale. Destination forms can be found at the weigh-in table, at the announcer's stand during shows, or in the fair office. We understand you may need to wait until after the shows to determine which animal to sell, but please have these forms filled out and turned in by FRIDAY AT NOON. Turn in to the superintendent, Will, or the fair office.

Vet Check

A reminder that when passing through the vet check

process on Tuesday, July 29, from 3:00-8:00 PM, it is the family's responsibility to assist the vet. If the 4-H member is old enough, it is expected that they will help handle the animal during inspection. Parents, please assist as needed to help keep the line moving as efficiently as possible. Be sure that animals are not covered by blankets, sheets, or wraps.

Animal Health

Now is the time to really focus on getting them ready for the fair and making sure they are happy and healthy. MAKE SURE THEY ARE CASTRATED!

Thursday, July 31- Farm Bureau of Girard will have their usual drink refreshments, and Heartland will be providing breakfast at the livestock show arena. Fair Camping

Each year, previous campers will be notified by mail of the procedure for reserving camping spots and the payment method by CCFA. After July 1st, any campsites not reserved will be open and can be reserved by contacting the CCFA.

Camping fees for the 2025 Crawford County Fair: \$200 for all campers and trailers paid prior to noon on July 27, 2025, \$10 for primitive camping (no access to electricity)

Campers who have reserved their location by paying fees may enter the Fairgrounds after 8:00 A.M. on Saturday, July 26, 2025, and set up their camper. Electricity will be turned on Sunday, July 27, 2025. Contact Mike Reese to reserve your spot.

Details of contest.

- The WPA (Work Projects Administration) was a government project in the 1930's. It hired young adults to work on community projects as a way to provide income and build communities. Some of the buildings built were the Fairgrounds Poultry Barn, Commercial Building, Open Class Building and 4H building. In recent years volunteers have been restoring those buildings and as a way to honor the completion of that project we created this contest.
- BUT in addition, there were other projects in Crawford County. This
 contest challenges exhibitors to research all of the projects in Crawford
 County and take photos of them. Select your 'best' photo and enter it in
 the contest. Contestants can enter as many photos as they wish.
- The photos will be judged and 1st and 2nd chosen in each of the categories.
- The Crawford County Museum will also be viewing photos to select some for display at the Museum during their WPA Special Exhibit.
- Entrants will grant permission for the photos to be displayed at the museum as well as other locations that will promote the Education of WPA
