The Next 4-H Council meeting will be Monday, April 15 at 7:30 p.m. Remember each club should have 2 council reps, 1 club president, and 2 adult leaders attend. If one is unable to attend then they need to find an alternate to fill in for that meeting.

Livestock Tag/Weigh-In

Below is some information for the Livestock Tag/Weigh In for the 2024 Fair. Remember it is not required that you weigh in but it is required for all market animals and bucket calves to be tagged in either on or before the designated days listed below. If you are unable to make the designated tag in days then you need to make prior arrangements with me to set a time to tag your animals. No animals will be tagged after the designated tag in days. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL LAST MINUTE TO MAKE THE ARRANGEMENTS IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO ATTEND OR YOU RISK NOT GETTING YOUR ANIMALS TAGGED IN ON TIME.

Market Steer/Feeder Steers- The tag/weigh in will be on Saturday March 23rd at Mesa Animal Clinic 518 E 47 Hwy, Girard, KS 66743 from 12:30-2:00PM. If you are unable to attend you must make prior arrangements with me to tag your animal or it will not be eligible to show at the fair. The tags are \$4 each please bring cash or a check made out to 4-H Council to pay for your tags. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL LAST MINUTE TO MAKE THE ARRANGEMENTS IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO ATTEND OR YOU RISK NOT GETTING YOUR ANIMALS TAGGED IN ON TIME.

Small Animals- Small Animals include Bucket Calves, Market Goats, Market Sheep, and Market Swine. This will be on Saturday April 27th 8:00-10:00am at the Fairgrounds. The tags are \$3 each for goats, sheep, and swine. The tags are \$4 each for bucket calves. Please bring cash or a check made out to 4-H Council to pay for your tags. If you are unable to attend you must make prior arrangements with me to tag your animal or it will not be eligible

to show at the fair. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL LAST MINUTE TO MAKE THE ARRANGEMENTS IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO ATTEND OR YOU RISK NOT GETTING YOUR ANIMALS TAGGED IN ON TIME. Breeding Class animals do not have to be tagged in however I encourage you to tag them in in the event something would happen to your Market Class animal.

Wanted Host Families for 2024

Looking for fun and excitement this summer? Host a new friend from Japan in your home this summer, July 23 – August 15. Kansas 4-H International

Exchange Programs are offering hosting opportunities for 35-40 families this summer. Host families are needed who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl. The Japanese youth will be between the ages of 12 - 16. Our responsibility is to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other.

Any Kansas family with children aged 10-17, who is interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. They can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is everyday family life.

Interested families can complete the application at https://www.states4hexchange.org/apply/host/ to start the process. The Japanese Delegates personal information forms arrive in February.
