We're not planning on it coming to that but we want to know to keep working on your projects! Awards are being ordered and we will have a fair! In the meantime check out the opportunities below we invite everyone to participate in!

Favorite Foods Contest

This is a chance for youth to show off their creative side and their favorite food! Youth are challenged to select a theme and then meal menu to go with it. From the meal menu select, one dish to make for your table and appropriately set the table for one. Table settings should include centerpieces. Youth will be judged on:

- Nutritional value of the dish they prepared
- Nutritional balanced menu
- Dish/menu is suitable for the theme selected
- Table setting appropriate for theme/food
- Knowledge and understanding of food preparation

Judging will be June 2nd online via Zoom with a local judge. Interested youth can find more information on their county website & our Facebook event Favorite Foods Contest. After signing up youth will be assigned a time with the judge on the afternoon of June 2nd!

get on the contact list, call your 4-H agent.


Horticulture/Crops Judging -

Learn parts of your livestock while having some fun coloring! This also helps you become a knowledgeable consumer while grocery shopping!




OUTDOOR SCAVENGER HUNT

4-H Tip- Take pictures & document activity in case you do the wildlife project at fair!


Option I


- Cut an orange in half

- Hang outside!


Option 2


- Smear peanut butter on outside of toilet paper roll

Fishy Cupcakes – a quick and easy break activity!









PREP TIME - 10 MINUTES
DECORATING TIME - 15 MINUTES
INGREDIENTS

COOK TIME -20 MINUTES TOTAL TIME-45 MINUTES

- Yellow, White, or Chocolate Cake Mix
- Ingredients cake mix box calls for
- M&M's separated by color
- Buttercream or favorite frosting
- Food coloring
- Eyes Wilton Candy eyeballs or mini marshmallow and dot of black frosting

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Make cupcakes according to cake mix instructions
- 2. Separate M&Ms by color, roughly 15 M&Ms for the scales on each cupcake and 2 red M&Ms for the lips
- 3. Make a batch of your favorite frosting or grab a container of buttercream frosting
- 4. Separate frosting into bowls and color with food coloring
- 5. Frost the cupcakes
- 6. Stare first row of "fish scale M&M's in the middle of the cupcake and work back to the edge.
- 7. Insert Wilton Candy Eye or mini marshmallow cut in half with a dot of black frosting
- 8. Add two red M&M's for fish lips

Rule of thirds: Most cameras have a setting that allows you to turn on a gird. Framing your subject off center appears more natural


Spacing: When capturing a moving object leave plenty of space in the direction the object is traveling/looking

Leading Lines: Use walls, fences, road lines, etc. to lead the eye to the main subject, or draw a connection between two objects





Button Down Shirt to Apron

State Horse 2020 Changes

See a full list of changes on the state 4-H website. 4-H members may participate in their designated District Horse Show plus one additional District Horse Show of their choosing. But before entering the Kansas State Fair, 4-H members must indicate which show their results will come from. There will be no picking of classes from each show, only results from one district show will be used. In order to show at the district/state level youth must be 9 years old and have completed their level one ridding and written test. Study material for these test can be found on our website or by contacting your 4-H agent. Testing times should be set up with your 4-H agent, the sooner the better!

Fair Poultry Testing Waived for 2020

Q: Why do we do Pullorum-Typhoid testing?

A: It is a disease that affects young birds and hatchlings but thanks to continuous testing by the Ks Dept. of Ag it is very rare to find. While the birds are gathered for the P-T test the Ks Dept. of Ag also takes a cheek swap for the Avian Influenza. However this year all testing is waived.

YOCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is required for youth (ages 8-21) who will be showing livestock at the Kansas State Fair or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (one exception is horses). In-person classes have been cancelled. Youth may take the online class for \$12.00 on the YQCA website, https://yqca.learngrow.io. Login using your 4-H Online user name and password. Youth will learn about reading feed tags, giving shots, and more! New in 2020, seven year olds may take the class as a learning opportunity. In 2021, the class ages will change from 8-21 to 7-21, as seven year olds competing in the Kansas Junior Livestock show be required to take the class.
