
Crawford County 4-H News

Applications are Open for Kansas Youth Leadership Council and National 4-H Conference

The application for and information about the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council and National Conference is open and available now! The Youth Council Application and National 4-H Conference Application will be combined again this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2026, may apply as a Council Rep, and those 15-18 before January 1, 2026, may apply for the National 4-H Conference. This year's Kansas Youth Leadership Forum delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one-year terms on the council. Up to 6 National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview prior to KYLF, and they serve a two-year term on the council. The deadline will be October 1, 2025

States' 4-H International Exchange Announces Outbound Programs for 2026

Five International partners have agreed to host U.S. 4-H'ers for outbound exchanges in the summer of 2026. Kansas 12-18-year-olds, at the time of the exchanges, are eligible to participate in one-month exchanges beginning in June and July with accepted applicants from other states. Destinations include Costa Rica, Japan, Taiwan, South Korea, and Argentina. All exchanges include a homestay with a host family. Japan's Labo offers a month-long study program in Tokyo with another family (prior to the 4-week program) for older participants, making it an 8-week offering. Argentina 4-H is offering a program of Spanish study and group activities, along with a homestay with a Cordoban local family next year. Adults, 25 and over, may apply as chaperones for each of the groups. Flyers are available describing each program, listing dates and approximate costs on the Kansas 4-H website: States' 4-H International Exchange Program. Kansas applications are due online by November 1, 2025, through the state's 4-H web-based application. The online application includes reference forms and photo requirements. Applicants will be expected to participate in interviews and a first orientation on November 21, 2025, in Junction City. Details will be communicated to applicants after November 1.

2025 Kansas 4-H Leadership Weekend

The Kansas 4-H Leadership Weekend will be

November 22-23 at Rock Springs 4-H Ranch and consists of the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum and the Kansas Volunteer Leader Forum.

KYLF is for youth ages 14-18 before January 1, 2026, and KVF is for all Kansas 4-H Volunteers.

KYLF will feature leadership workshops, Youth

Council Elections, and opportunities to learn and have fun. The Kansas 4-H Volunteer Leader Forum will feature workshops and information to help volunteers be more effective and learn from each other. This Forum for adults is organized by the Kansas Association of 4-H Volunteers.

Registration will open in September. Again, this year, participants in both forums will register through the same system. Registration deadline is October 15, 2025, for both events. There will also be an option for coming in on Friday evening and having breakfast Saturday morning for those coming from a distance.

Plan for the future! 4-H Camp Scholarships

Camp Scholarships are available through the 4-H Council. These are limited to one per youth per year. To be eligible for this you must complete a Talk/Demonstration at County 4-H Club Days or participate in Favorite Foods Contest. The Scholarship will be refunded up to \$100 upon the youth's return from camp. This is a great way for youth to experience more youth development opportunities! There is also the scholarship from Carolyn Zagonel and Americas Farmers Grow Comminutes donation. By filling out this application youth can receive a \$100 scholarship to go toward a 4-H camp/activity. Please call Will if you have any questions.

Youth Test Livestock Knowledge

Members of the Wildcat Extension District 4-H judging teams traveled to K-State campus to test their livestock knowledge in four contests. The livestock industry's future looks bright in Southeast Kansas as local youth brought back several awards! The judging teams for Wildcat Extension District are composed of four counties: Crawford, Labette, Montgomery, and Wilson. Nine youth from the district participated in livestock judging, meat judging, livestock skill-a-thon, and livestock quiz bowl. Results for our Wildcat teams were:

Sweepstakes, an overall average of all the contests:

• Sixth place overall

Livestock judging, confirmation judging of an animal against an ideal standard:

- Third overall team and top reasons team consisted of Kole Harris, Kinsley Harris, Weston Koenig, and Hadley Fields.
- 28th overall team consisted of Maleeya Montee, Maddox Montee, Tatum Francis, and Allison Zagonel.

Meat judging, identifies and places cuts of meat based on the quality, leanness, and composition:

• Ninth overall team consisted of: Kole Harris, Weston Koenig, Kinsley Harris

Skill-a-thon, youth demonstrate their animal science knowledge and management through written tests:

- Tenth place overall team consisted of Kinley Harris, Kole Harris, Weston Koenig, and Hadley Fields
- 27th overall team consisted of Maleeya Montee, Maddox Montee, Jacob Tharp, and Tatum Francis
- Allison Zagonel competed as an individual

Quiz Bowl, question and answer rounds completed using a buzzer system to test livestock knowledge:

 Seventh overall team consisted of Weston Koenig, Kinsley Harris, Kole Harris, and Jacob Tharp

Judging teams allow youth to gain hands-on, practical livestock industry knowledge by working with dedicated volunteer coaches.
