For **Senior age 4-H members who were project award winners** in their area and are looking to advance their record books to the regional level, please check the <u>Regional Screening & State</u> <u>Project Award Evaluation Guidelines.</u> The following items must be turned in for a complete Regional Project Award submission:

- 1. Check Sheet
- 2. Personal Information Page
- 3. Project Report Form
- 4. Cover Letter
- 5. Resume

Each 4-H'er must submit a separate project award for each program they are eligible.

Before practices begin, you will be required to have a choke chain, leash, regular collar, close toed shoes, and treats are recommended.

This project is for youth who are interested in learning more about dogs, how to care for a dog and how to train a dog in basic or advanced commands. Any kind of dog may be used in this unique project that is not designed to conform to the American Kennel Club or other professional standards.

## Summer 4-H Educator/Intern

Do you have summers off and are looking for a fun opportunity to give back to our youth? We are actively searching for our Summer Educator/Intern. Last year, our Labette County intern, Holden Vail, was able to provide programs to youth through USD 506 summer school classes, libraries, held events at the fair, youth camps, helped with Maker's Camp and Kitchen Kids Can Cook camps. The application portal is now open and will remain open until the positions are filled. For best consideration, apply by December 16, 2022. Selected applicants will have placement notification by mid-March. This full-time, eleven-week internship will run approximately May 22, 2023 -August 4, 2023. Applicants must be 18 years of age. Pay is \$17/hour.

## **Entomology Project Meetings**

## 2023 Kansas Corn School

The Southeast Kansas Corn School will be held on **January 20**, **2023**, at the Southeast Research-Extension Center in Parsons from **9 AM** – **1:30 PM**. The main purpose of Kansas Corn School is to provide in-depth training targeted for corn producers in the region. The issues of most concern to Kansas corn growers now include markets and cost-return, weed control, disease management, production practices, and farm policy. There will also be focus on increasing profits and yield stability over time. The goal is to emphasize and promote practices that can help farmers manage future production challenges and pursue effective avenues to increase profits. Corn School is free to attend and lunch will be provided.

#### K-State Junior Swine Producer Day

The 2023 K-State Junior Swine Producer Day has been scheduled for Saturday, March 11, in Manhattan! Participants of all skill levels are invited to sign up and attend! The cost is \$20/person and the deadline to register is February 15.

Meetings are typically held at the Altamont Community Building at 7 PM, but any necessary changes will be communicated closer to the meeting date. *Remember each club should have 2 council reps, 1 club president, and 2 adult leaders or adult volunteers attend.* If one is unable to attend, they need to find an alternate to fill in for that meeting. The purpose of 4-H Council is to establish learning

activities that are beneficial to all clubs, but not feasible for individual clubs to do alone. Through the planning and conducting of these country-wide activities, many leadership opportunities have been available to youth and adults. Opportunities include events such as 4-H Club Day, Camps, Achievement Banquet, Trips, Fundraising, National 4-H Week and 48 Hours of 4-H.
