Pork Bundle Sales

Tickets will be \$1 each. Proceeds go to 4-H Council to support various things throughout the year such as camp scholarships, achievement banquet supplies, plaques, etc. **Raffle tickets will be due on or before July 17**th. Any member participating in the fair is required to sell at least **two** bundles of tickets 4-H and FFA members. 4-H Royalty will be based on club nomination and ticket sales.

Anyone selling \$250 or more of pork bundle tickets will be eligible to participate in a trip to a theme park such as Silver Dollar City or Worlds of Fun as well as receive all other incentives for that level of sales. All royalty crowned in 2023 as well as 2022 royalty will be able to participate in the trip as well.

Kansas 4-H Horse Safety Webinar

4-H Horse Project members wishing to compete at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show must complete the **Horse Safety Webinar** and pass the quiz in addition to other requirements. The webinar and quiz are available on the Kansas 4-H Equine Webinar page http://bit.ly/3zbn5XC, must be completed prior to the entry deadline (**August 1, 2023**). Photography Entries

Photography mount boards and protective sleeves are available for purchase at the Extension Office in Altamont M-F 8:00AM-4:30PM. Photos have to be mounted in a specific direction and have the ID tag placed on them as well. You can pick the tags up when you get your boards.

Fairground Work Days

All 4-H & FFA livestock exhibitors who plan to sell an animal in the livestock premium sale, must record a minimum of **2 hours** of volunteer time prior to the fair. The last workday will be **Saturday**, **June 10th**, from **8AM – 10AM**. Please bring paint cups and wear old clothes.

State Livestock Nomination Info

The 2023 information for state livestock nominations has been released. The process transitioned to an online system in 2022, so there are no longer physical forms for families to complete and mail. Families will purchase DNA envelopes in advance, submit their animal and exhibitor information online, then mail their completed and signed DNA samples by the deadline. Extension Agents and FFA Advisors will approve nominations online. Exhibitors who nominated animals last year (in 2022) need to use their existing ShoWorks account. Those who need help accessing their account may request a password reset through ShoWorks or contact the Youth Livestock Program for assistance. Returning exhibitors should not create a new account.

All market animals and commercial females youth would like to be eligible for the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS must be nominated.

Small Animal nominations are due by June 15. The deadline to order DNA envelopes has been moved up to 10 days prior to the deadline, which is June 5. Families are highly encouraged to use the resources available, especially the Rookie Guide.
