Skill-a-thon tests a 4-H member's knowledge and comprehension of animal science and livestock management practices. Typical topics are livestock equipment identification, livestock breed identification, retail meat cut identification, Hay and wool judging, quality assurance, and a quiz about the livestock industry.

Quiz Bowl contestants answer questions via a buzzer system on wide array of questions that cover the beef, sheep, swine and meat goat project areas.

Livestock Judging – rank pens of beef, sheep, swine, and meat goats based on the animal's production or reproduction qualities.

Kansas 4-H Horseless Horse

Questions have come concerning the Horseless Horse project; below are clarifications based on learning and risk management:

- 4-H member does not own or lease a horse.
- Project intended to offer a 4-H member opportunity to learn about horses.
- 4-H member may participate in judging contests, quiz bowl, hippology and give presentations.
- 4-H member may volunteer to assist another 4-H member at horse show and trails rides.
- Project member may exhibit at local fair with a borrowed 4-H Identified horse in the showmanship class only.
- No riding.

HORSE ID INFORMATION

Horse ID's are due in the Extension Office prior to May 1, 2019. ID Papers are required to show any horse. Stop by the Extension Office to pick-up new ID forms if you have a new horse or drop-off your ID Papers from last year for returning horses. At the office, forms will be signed and mailed to you for your records.

4-H Campference

4-H Campference is for youth ages 12-14 (before January 1, 2019), and will be held June 23-26 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Participants will experience the feel of a conference, while enjoying the 'camp' activities Rock Springs 4-H Center has to offer. This is a great transitional opportunity, as tweens go from being a camper to attending educational conferences. 4-H Campference will feature workshops about opportunities in the 4-H program and how to better interact with others. Registration and detailed information will be the State 4-H Website in March. Register early as the space will fill on a first come basis, and Campference was full the last five years! Register online by May 15 (or earlier it will close when it is full) and payment must be in the local Extension Offices by May 15.

Citizenship in Action

Kansas youth ages 13-18 are invited to spend a weekend touring the Kansas capitol, meeting with legislators, and learning how to make a difference in their community. The trip will be February 17-18th and will cost \$175, which includes lodging, most meals, a banquet, and a dance. The registration deadline is February 1st. The system is integrated with 4-H Online which makes it easy for families to access their information and keep organized. The use of this system district wide will not only create more time, but also resources for greater more impactful programs. With the transition of utilizing this system will align the us with the rules and regulations at the state level. Adjustments will include age break outs for classes, smoother entry process, and even the opportunity to offer more classes.
