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Medicare Prescription Drug Costs Hard to Swallow?

Did you know that you can review and change your Medicare Prescription Drug Plan annually? Medicare Open Enrollment, running from October 15th-December 7th, is the period of time that you can do just that!

It is a good idea to compare plans to see if another plan will offer better coverage at a more affordable price. Last year, Wildcat District Senior Health Insurance Counseling for Kansas (SHICK) in Crawford, Labette, Montgomery, and Wilson counties helped area beneficiaries save almost \$87,000.00 or an average savings of \$621.00 per person changing plans.

Here are some questions and answers to why you should compare plans this fall!

Q: I've been happy with my plan, can choosing a new drug plan really make a difference?

A: You should receive an Annual Notice of Change from your Part D plan. Each year, insurance companies can make changes to Medicare plans that can impact out-of-pocket costs—monthly premiums, deductibles, drug costs, and pharmacy "networks." They can also make changes to the plan's "formulary" or list of covered drugs.

You may also have added or taken a medication off of your current list that may affect which drug plan comes up best for you for 2021.

Q: I've heard about a \$35.00 cost for insulin, is there a plan out there for that?

A: Kansas will offer nine prescription drug plans with potential for a 30 day supply of insulin at \$35.00. However, whether or not that is the best plan for your current situation depends on the other medications you take. It is important to look at the whole picture.

Q: What do I need to have to complete a 2021 Prescription Drug Plan Comparison?

A: Whether you compare plans yourself by going to www.medicare.gov or visit with a SHICK counselor, you will need your Medicare card plus a list of your prescription medications, including the dosage and how often you take the drug. If you have created a MyMedicare account, you will need your username and password to log in.

Q: How do I get free, unbiased, and confidential help with Medicare Open Enrollment?

A: Many K-State Research and Extension offices have SHICK Counselors to assist beneficiaries in comparing plans during open enrollment.
