Studies are finding that less clutter and fewer toys encourage kids to use their imagination more freely and be more focused. In addition, experiences lead to longer-lasting happiness because there is enjoyment in the anticipation, the activity itself, and the memories created. The memories from an experience become part of a child's identity and help foster emotional growth by encouraging exploration, socialization, and bonding with loved ones.

Here are some ideas to consider when giving experiential gifts:

- Memberships & Passes: Zoos, children's museums, science centers, or botanical gardens.
- Fun Outings: Movie tickets, a trip to the arcade, a "day of yes" where kids choose the activities within a set budget, or tickets to a performance.
- Travel & Adventure: An overnight stay at a waterpark hotel, a weekend trip to a nearby city, an outdoor adventure, or a camping trip.
- Family Time Coupons: One-on-one dates with mom or dad, sleepovers at grandma and grandpa's house, or getting a mani/pedi together
- Lessons & Classes: Swimming, dance, horseback riding, cooking, art, or music lessons.

This holiday season, consider swapping material items for shared adventures that create lasting memories and strengthen family bonds. Investing in experiences gives children joy that lasts far beyond the holidays—and builds memories they'll treasure for years to come.
